Course no: 1	Title: Take a Bow	KLA: Creative Arts- Drama
Date: Wednesday 19 June 2013	Venue: Grose View PS	Target Years: 3, 4

Description: The children will have the opportunity to work with a published author in a workshop setting. The writing process will be explored in a series of entertaining and challenging writing/discussion activities. Children will be able to develop an idea into a viable "story start".

Course no: 3	Title: Got to Dance	KLA: Creative and Practical Arts
Date: Thursday 27 June 2013	Venue: Wilberforce Public School	Target Years: 5, 6

Description: Students will explore the different elements and components of dance, and how these elements are used in performances to convey messages or stories, to a range of audiences. Students will experiment in a range of different dance styles and techniques, including jazz, hip- hop, lyrical, country pop and contemporary popular. After investigating the elements of dance, and varying dance styles, students will apply their knowledge to choreograph a dance routine, in small groups, to selected piece of music. The groups will perform their dance pieces to an audience at the conclusion of the course.

Description: Students will receive an in depth look at life in the medieval period of castles and knights. They will		
explore the purpose and structure of castles, and the lives of people in them, the process of becoming a knight and		
his place in the feudal system.

Description: The Drum Circle is a hands-on experience like no other! All students will each have a drum and various other percussion instruments, including (but not limited to) drums, shakers, guiros, claves and bells. Every student is included in the circle, and their particular voice (or instrument) is heard and appreciated. Students explore playing techniques for the different instruments through fun exercises and games. This is achieved in an environment that encourages creativity and personal expression while working together as a group. The workshop incorporates simple and achievable rhythms that when played together produce a powerful groove.

students and parents will be allowed to taste their creation and are provided with a copy of the recipe to practise		
and continue making their dishes at home.		

Course no: 11	Title: Hands on Clay – Ceramic Workshop	KLA: Visual Arts
Date: Thursday 20 June 2013	Venue: Windsor High School	Target Years: 4, 5, 6

Description: *Hands on Clay* is designed to provide students with the experience of an actual professional pottery studio. Students will create a bowl inspired by an animal theme of their choice. They will be taught how to create basic cylindrical and bowl forms through the instruction of hand building and throwing techniques. Focus will be on the process and the enjoyment of exploring, working and creating with your hands in clay.

Each student will design and create two acrylic objects, which may include twisty key rings, spinning tops, wristbands, playing dice or sushi trays using all the skills and knowledge they have experienced.
